# **Council of Kadosh**

#### Brethren,

We are now over the hump. July and August are here.

I'd like to congratulate our brethren who have received their 32nd Degree. Hat's off to the cast and crew for their performance and work. Congratulations to the deserving students who received scholarships from the Scottish Rite Foundation.

#### The Scottish Rite Council of Kadosh: July and August History

#### **Important July Events**

July has been significant in Scottish Rite history:

**July 18, 1740** - One of the earliest references to Scottish degrees appeared in Bristol, England, when a lodge decided that Master Masons could be made "Scotch Masters."

**July 12, 1875** - The Honolulu Council of Kadosh received its charter, bringing Scottish Rite Masonry to Hawaii. William C. Parke, who served as Marshal of the Kingdom of Hawaii for 34 years, became the first Commander.

**July 14, 1911** - The Lodge of Perfection #1 in Juneau, Alaska received its charter, marking the first Scottish Rite presence in Alaska. A full set of Scottish Rite bodies was established there in 1915.

#### **Important August Events**

August also holds special meaning for Scottish Rite history:

**August 4-5, 1813** - Important organizational work took place in New York City. Emanuel De La Motta, a prominent Scottish Rite leader from Savannah, Georgia, helped establish Scottish Rite activities in New York. These events were crucial for organizing the rite's expansion throughout the United States.

#### The Feast of Kadosh

Many Scottish Rite groups celebrate an annual Feast of Kadosh to honor the traditions of these degrees. This celebration includes ceremonies, fellowship, and reflection on the moral lessons of the Council of Kadosh. It helps members renew their commitment to truth, justice, and spiritual growth.

#### **Today's Relevance**

The Council of Kadosh remains active in Scottish Rite Masonry today. Its teachings about moral courage, honesty, and spiritual development are still relevant to modern members. Scottish Rite groups around the world continue to perform these degrees and commemorate their historical foundations.

The July and August events that shaped the Council of Kadosh show how dedicated early members were to spreading these teachings. From England to Hawaii to Alaska, these historical milestones demonstrate the universal appeal of the Kadosh degrees' message of truth, justice, and spiritual excellence.
